ACWA Power Bookpoort, has successfully delivered boreholes, water pumps, and solar panels to multiple farms, improving access to essential infrastructure in this water-scarce area.



AcwaPower's continued support included the drilling of two boreholes, the supply and delivery of animal watering infrastructure and the supply and installation of two solar pumps. Part of its support is to supply emergency animal feed and medicine in the event of any devastating incidents.

This programme has not only uplifted the community but has revolutionized the agricultural landscape for female farmers, enabling more women to overcome the traditional barriers.

BURSARIES, APPRENTICESHIPS & INTERNSHIPS

The program starts with a rigorous interview process, before successful learners take part into the 30-month apprenticeship program and awarded bursaries to study qualifications of their choice and a University or College. These game-changing initiatives have benefitted more than 100 learners within the 50km radius of the plant.

To date there has been more than 15 graduates offered internships in the Finance and SeD departments.

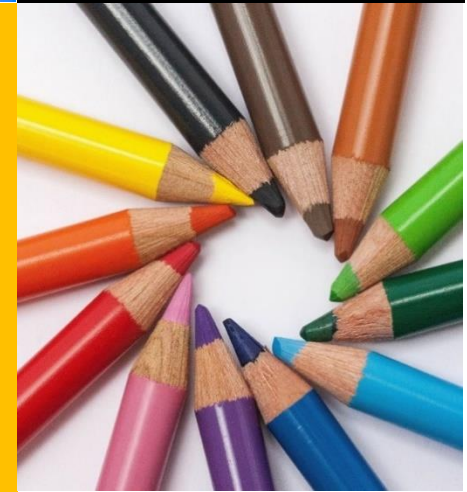
Ten graduates have been appointed on a permanent basis in the Electrical Engineering department.
